10TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION AND 2020 GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE NYA: RESEARCH, POLICY AND SDGS REALIZATION IN NIGERIA: CHALLENGES AND IMPLICATIONS

The 10th Anniversary and General Assembly of the NYA was held at the Conference Hall of the Nigerian Stored Products Research Institute, Akoka, Yaba, Lagos. The event held from December 1-2, 2020. This was a momentous event as it featured a celebration of the Academy's 10th year of existence. However, in line with the prevailing COVID-19 protocols, the event was hosted in hybrid format; with only the leadership of the Academy, new members who were inducted at the event, exiting members who were decorated as fellows, prize winners and a few special guests in physical attendance, while all other members and participants joined virtually via Zoom. The President of the Nigerian Academy of Science, Prof. Mosto Onuoha (represented by the NAS Executive Secretary, Dr. Doyin Odubanjo), delivered the goodwill message of NAS. The keynote address on the theme "Research, Policy and SDGs Realization in Nigeria: Challenges and Implications" was delivered by Distinguished Prof. Babajide I. Alo (FAS).

In his keynote address, the Foreign Affairs Secretary of the Nigerian Academy of Science and the Director, Center for Environmental Human Resources Development, UNILAG, noted that there seem to be a disconnect between research policies and the SDGs in

Nigeria, which in addition to the existing lack of/weak research culture and poor funding, are mitigating the realization of the SDGs in Nigeria. He however called for a strategic paradigm shift in integrating research and scientific advisory into government policies and decision-making, while highlighting the need for investment in demand-driven, contextual and impactful research that can guide decision making. Ultimately, **Science can inform policy, but policies can (and should) direct science towards the greater (and more equal) good.**

The ceremony also featured a panel discussion with the past and present NYA presidents on NYA – Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow, cutting of the 10th Anniversary cake, conferment of the fellowship of the Academy on twelve distinguished members who successfully completed their five-year term and induction of twenty-three new members into the Academy. Five outstanding young researchers were also honoured with National Young Scientists prizes.

The NYA appreciates the unflinching support of NAS, as well as the University of Lagos and the Deputy Vice-Chancellor of the University of Lagos for financial and logistical support to make the event a success.

As an Academy that is rooted in a deep culture of excellence, the NYA honoured five outstanding young researchers with the National Young Scientist Prizes in different fields during the 10th Anniversary and General Assembly. The winners were selected following a review of all nominations/applications received. The categories of awards presented and the winners were as follows:

1. Prof. Oyewale Tomori National Young Scientist Prize for Research in Microbiology won by Dr Ebiye Ejikeugwu of Ebonyi State University, Abakaliki.
2. Prof. Friday E. Okonofua National Young Scientist Prize for Research in the Health Sciences won by Dr Victor Nna of

University of Calabar, Calabar.

3. Prof. Kayode Adebowale National Young Scientist Prize for Research in the Chemical Sciences won by Dr Jimoh Tijani of Federal University of Technology, Minna.
4. Prof. Kayode Adebowale National Young Female Scientist Prize for Research in the Chemical Sciences won by Dr Blessing Umeokoli of Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Awka
5. Professor Aderemi Kuku National Young Scientists' Prize for the Mathematical Sciences won by Dr Isaac Lare Animasaun of Federal University of Technology, Akure.

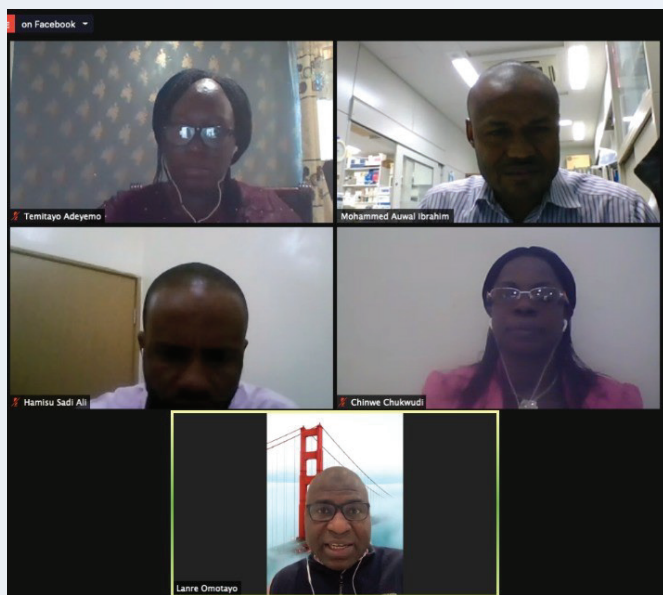

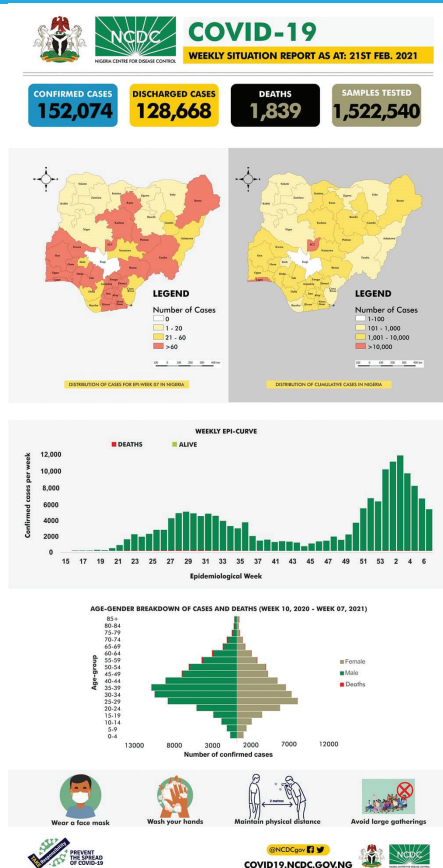

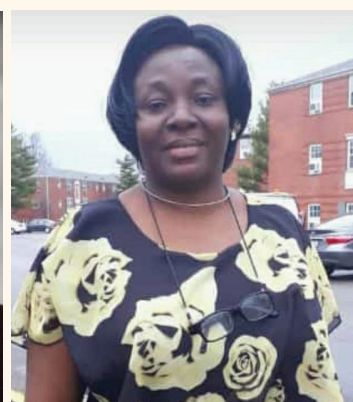
PROMOTIONS

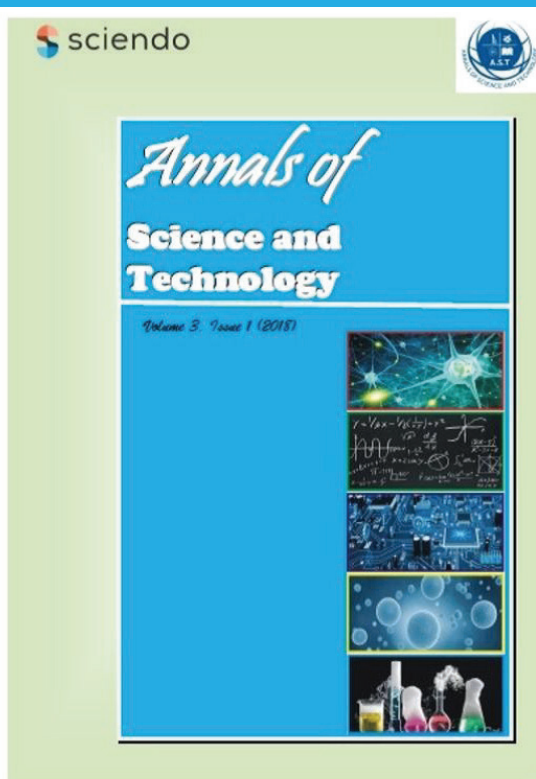
ELIGIBILITY FOR PRIZES AND MEMBERSHIP

ii. Candidates should show evidence of scholarly research in their fields and must be affiliated to a not-for-profit research institution in Nigeria (e.g. Higher institutions or research institutes).
iii. For prizes, only Nigerian citizens who have lived and worked in Nigeria for no less than 3 years will be considered.
iv. Candidates must hold at least a Master's degree in relevant disciplines.
v. Persons who have applied for prizes are not eligible to apply for NYA membership or vice versa. Multiple applications from an applicant for different NYA awards will be automatically disqualified.
vi. Members/Fellows of the NYA and previous winners are excluded from competing for these prizes.

NIGERIAN ACADEMY OF SCIENCE INDUCTS FIRST FEMALE PRESIDENT

The Nigerian Academy of Science, at its Annual General Meeting held virtually on Thursday, 28th January, 2021, has inducted Professor Ekanem Ikpi Braide FAS as the President of NAS. Prof. Braide is the 19th President of the Academy, and the first female President in 44 years of its existence. Professor Braide, a Professor of Parasitology/Epidemiol-

ogy was a member of the national committee that achieved the laudable feat of guinea worm eradication in Nigeria. She served as Vice Chancellor, Cross River University of Technology (CRUTECH) Calabar, Nigeria (2004 to 2009) and as Pioneer Vice Chancellor, Federal University, Lafia, Nigeria (2011 to 2016). She is currently the Pro-Chancellor of Arthur Jarvis University, Akpabuyo, Nigeria. She took over from Professor Mosto Onuoha FAS (Professor of Pure and Applied Geophysics), and will lead the Academy, for the next four years, in achieving an improved quality of life for the Nigerian society through the promotion and application of science and technology; as well as strengthen the nation's ability to deliver the fruits of science to society by the acquisition, growth, and dissemination of sound scientific knowledge and facilitation of its use in the solution of major national problems.
